

THE ANCIENT AND ACCEPTED SCOTTISH RITE

The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, consisting of thirty-three degrees, is governed and administered by Bodies of the Thirty-third Degree called Supreme Councils. Of these, the oldest in the world is that for the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States, located at Washington, District of Columbia, but whose See is at Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, where it was organized. It was established on the 31st day of May, 1801, and from it all other Supreme Councils now existing have mediately or immediately originated.

Everywhere, except in Great Britain, Canada, Chile, and the United States, the Supreme Councils administer all the degrees, and the Inspectors confer the Blue degrees, and establish Masters' Lodges; and these are chartered and governed by the Supreme Councils. The Supreme Councils of the United States have never exercised these powers for the sake of harmony, leaving the Blue degrees to be administered under the authority of the Grand Lodges, and themselves never chartering Symbolic Lodges.

The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite is more widely extended than any other system, no other being worked to any extent in the Latin countries of Europe and America.

It is only required that a candidate for the Ineffable and higher degrees, even to the Thirty-third, should be a lawful Master Mason in good standing. No more can be required.

The necessity for the Scottish Rite degrees, with their philosophy, moral and intellectual, and their political and religious truths, is perhaps greater today than at any time in the past.

The battle in behalf of the great principles of Human Freedom, Free Government, Free Thought, Free Speech and Free Conscience is still being waged and the contest in behalf of the moral excellencies of Masonry, Justice, Honesty, Temperance, Charity and Forgiveness of Injuries has not ended.

Mcn still need to be taught not to revile others on account of political, philosophical or religious opinions; that they should never forsake or desert a friend when in adversity, in sickness or distress, that in all things they should control their appetites and subdue their evil propensities.

ALLEGIANCE

The four Co-ordinate Bodies of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Free Masonry, sitting in the Valley of Austin, Orient of Texas, derive their charters from and acknowledge and yield allegiance to the Supreme Council of the Thirty-third degree for the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States (Mother Council of the World, of Sovereign Grand Inspector-General) whose See is at the Grand Orient of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina.

SECRETARY'S BULLETIN

An applicant for the degrees in this Valley must be an affiliated Master Mason in good standing, and a resident of the State of Texas for six months. If lodge membership is held outside of Texas, a certificate of good standing or receipt for dues for the current year must accompany the petition. Forfeiture of rights as a Master Mason for any reason works a forfeiture ipso facto of all rights in the Scottish Rite.

It is not required that the degrees in all of the different Bodies shall be taken at one session. A candidate may stop at the close of any one Body, if it is not convenient to proceed further.

PATENTS

Handsomely executed patents (in Latin and English) will be furnished all new members who attain the Thirty-second degree. They are issued under the seal of the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States of America.

LADIES' CERTIFICATES

The Supreme Council issues certificates to the wife, widow, mother, sister or daughter of any Thirty-second degree member of the Rite in this Jurisdiction. These certificates are obtainable through the Secretary. The price is \$2.00. Data required for certificate: Name in full; date of birth;

Data required for certificate: Name in full; date of birth; residence; relationship (wife, widow, mother, sister, daughter); the brother's name in full and degree; and his residence.

RING 14°

Perfect Elus (14°) of this Jurisdiction should wear the ring of the degree on the third finger of the right hand (not counting the thumb); it should be a flat gold band without any mark or device on it; engraved within the ring the motto of the degree, "Virtus Junxit Mors Non Separabit" (Whom Virtue Unites Death Cannot Separate), also the name of the brother, and the date on which he received the Fourteenth degree.

ADMISSION BY CARD ONLY

Brethren will please take notice, that in accordance with the Statutes of the Supreme Council and under our By-Laws, a Brother not in possession of an identification card for the current year, cannot be admitted to the meetings of the reunion or of the Bodies of the Rite. Identification cards must be presented to the registration committee. THIS RULE IS IMPERATIVE.

Identification cards can only be issued by the Secretary, upon payment of dues in full, including the calendar year.

VISITORS

The law requires all visitors to have properly authenticated patents or letters of credence, together with identification cards from Bodies recognized by and in relations of amity with the Supreme Council of the Southern Masonic Jurisdiction, A. A. S. Rite of the United States of America.

BY-LAWS REGARDING ARREARS FOR DUES

Our By-Laws provide that any Brother in arrears for annual dues for two years shall be dropped from the roll of membership.

SUSPENSION IN BLUE LODGE

If a member is suspended in his Blue Lodge for non-payment of dies, or other cause, he automatically loses his membership in the Sectlish Rite Bodies.

REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE SCOTTISH RITE BODIES

Regular meetings of the Scottish Rite Bodies are held on the first Friday in each month.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Kindly notify the Secretary of any change in your postoffice address, in order that communications addressed to you may be delivered promptly. The last address furnished him is the one used, and should you change your residence without notifying him your mail may fail of delivery.

SPECIAL TO CANDIDATES

Candidates must report to the Secretary at the Scottish Rite Cathedral not later than S:30 a. m., Monday, November 5, 1923. The class will be promptly organized at that time, and anyone absenting himself will delay the work just that much and confuse the proper handling of the matters essential to such organization. Candidates living in the city may present themselves on Saturday or Sunday before the Reunion for registration. This will help out materially in preventing a rush in the office on the first day of the Reunion.

among our order who are capable and willing to do their part, thereby releasing many loyal workers, who are carrying more than their share, by serving in various parts of several degrees.



WHAT SCOTTISH RITE MASONRY IS DOING IN TEXAS

SCOTTISH RITE DORMITORY FOR GIRLS

Three years ago, at the call of Samuel Poyntz Cochran, 33°, Sovereign Grand Inspector General in Texas, the five Consistories in the State and their co-ordinate Bodies by resolution agreed to devote for a period of three years one-half of their gross receipts from fees and for a period of the two years following one-third of their gross proceeds from the same source to the purpose of erecting a dormitory at the University of Texas, the dormitory to be used for the purpose of housing the daughters of Master Masons while at the University of Texas in a home-like atmosphere and at cost.

For two years the dormitory was maintained in leased property, and in October, 1922, the new dormitory, housing three hundred and six young women, was put into operation. It is now entering upon its second year. Every Scottish Rite Mason in Texas should visit this dormitory in order that he may realize to what extent Scottish Rite Masonry in Texas has entered the field of education.

This dormitory is governed by a board of directors headed by the Sovereign Grand Inspector General in Texas and composed of two members of each Consistory in Texas. The personnel of the board is Sam P. Cochran, 33°, of Dallas, President; J. W. McClendon, 33°, of Austin, First Vice-president; W. S. Fly, 33°, of San Antonio, Second Vice-president; H. A. Wroe, 33°, of Austin, Treasurer; Joe H. Muenster, 33°, of Austin, Secretary; D. W. McCleod, 33°, of Galveston; T. J. Holbrook, 32° K. C. C. H., of Galveston; W. C. Temple, 33°, of Dallas; F. H. Sparrow, 33°, of Fort Worth; Crawford Harvie, 32° K. C. C. H., of El Paso; J. J. Ormsbee, 33°, of El Paso; D. K. Woodward, 32° K. C. C. H. of Austin, and J. K. Blackstone, 33°, of San Antonio.

SCOTTISH RITE LOAN FUND

Through gifts from individuals and donations from Scottish Rite classes there has been built up a loan fund, which is handled by the Scottish Rite Educational Association, that is assisting many Master Masons and the sons and daughters of Master Masons to gain a college education.

This fund was originated at the time the original plans were made for building the Scottish Rite Dormitory for girls and for almost three years has served its purpose well. Various Scottish Rite classes over the State have been very generous in turning over free will offerings to this fund, and many a young man and young woman would never be allowed the privilege of attending the University of Texas or other educational institutions were it not for receiving the benefits of this fund.

The Students' Loan Fund is administered by a committee composed of Sam P. Cochran, 33°, of Dallas; D. K. Woodward, Jr., 32° K. C. C. H.; J. W. McClendon, 33°; T. W. Currie, 18°, and Joe H. Muenster, 33°, all of Austin.




