

The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite

The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, consisting of thirty-three degrees, is governed and administered by Bodies of the Thirty-third Degree called Supreme Councils. Of these, the oldest in the world is that for the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States, located at Washington, District of Columbia, but whose See is at Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, where it was organized. It was established on the 31st day of May, 1801, and from it all other Supreme Councils now existing have mediately or immediately originated.

Everywhere, except in Great Britain, Canada, Chile, and the United States, the Supreme Councils administer all the degrees, and the Inspectors confer for the Blue degrees, and establish Masters' Lodges; and these are chartered and governed by the Supreme Councils. The Supreme Councils of the United States have never exercised these powers for the sake of harmony, leaving the Blue degrees to be administered under the authority of the Grand Lodges, and themselves never chartering Symbolic Lodges.

The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite is more widely extended than any other system, no other being worked to any extent in the Latin countries of Europe and America.

It is only required that a candidate for the Ineffable and higher degrees, even to the Thirty-third, should be a lawful Master Mason in good standing. No more can be required.

The necessity for the Scottish Rite degrees, with their philosophy, moral and intellectual, and their political and religious truths is perhaps greater today than at any time in the past.

The battle in behalf of the great principles of Human Freedom, Free Government, Free Thought, Free Speech and Free Conscience is still being waged and the contest in behalf of the moral excellencies of Masonry, Justice, Honesty, Temperance, Charity and Forgiveness of Injuries has not ended.

Men still need to be taught not to revile others on account of political, philosophical or religious opinions; that they should never forsake or desert a friend when in adversity, in sickness or distress, that in all things they should control their appetites and subdue their evil propensities.

The four Co-ordinate Bodies of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Free Masonry, sitting in the Valley of Austin, Orient of Texas, derive their charters from and acknowledge and yield allegiance to the Supreme Council of the Thirty-third degree for the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States (Mother Council of the World, of Sovereign Grand Inspector-General) whose See is at the Grand Orient of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina.

Secretary's Bulletin

An applicant for the degrees in this Valley must be an affiliated Master Mason in good standing, and a resident of the State of Texas for six months. If lodge membership is held outside of Texas, a certificate of good standing or receipt for dues for the current year must accompany the petition. Forfeiture of rights as a Master Mason for any reason works a forfeiture ipso facto of all rights in the Scottish Rite.

It is not required that the degrees in all of the different Bodies shall be taken at one session. A candidate may stop at the close of any one Body, if it is not convenient to proceed further.

PATENTS

Handsomely executed patents (in Latin and English) will be furnished all new members who attain the Thirty-second degree. They are issued under the seal of the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States of America.

LADIES' CERTIFICATES

The Supreme Council issues certificates to the wife, widow, mother, sister or daughter of any Thirty-second degree member of the Rite in this Jurisdiction. These certificates are obtainable through the Secretary. The price is \$2.00.

Data required for certificate: Name in full; date of birth; residence; relationship (wife, widow, mother, sister, daughter); the brother's name in full and degree; and his residence.

RING 14°

Perfect Elus (14°) of this Jurisdiction should wear the ring of the degree on the third finger of the left hand (not counting the thumb); it should be a flat gold band without any mark or device on it; engraved within the ring the motto of the degree, "Virtus Junxit Mors Non Separabit" (Whom Virtue Unites Death Cannot Separate), also the name of the brother, and the date on which he received the Fourteenth degree.

ADMISSION BY CARD ONLY

Brethren will please take notice, that in accordance with the Statutes of the Supreme Council and under our By-Laws, a Brother not in possession of an identification card for the current year, cannot be admitted to the meetings of the reunion or of the Bodies of the Rite. Identification cards must be presented to the registration committee. **THIS RULE IS IMPERATIVE.**

Identification cards can only be issued by the Secretary, upon payment of dues in full, including the calendar year.

VISITORS

The law requires all visitors to have properly authenticated patents or letters of credence, together with identification cards from Bodies recognized by and in relations of amity with the Supreme Council of the Southern Masonic Jurisdiction, A. A. S. Rite of the United States of America.

SUSPENSION IN BLUE LODGE

If a member is suspended in his Blue Lodge for nonpayment of dues, or other cause, he automatically loses his membership in the Scottish Rite Bodies.

REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE SCOTTISH RITE BODIES

Regular meetings of the Scottish Rite Bodies are held on the first Friday in each month.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Kindly notify the Secretary of any change in your postoffice address, in order that communications addressed to you may be delivered promptly. The last address furnished him is the one used, and should you change your residence without notifying him your mail may fail of delivery.

SPECIAL TO CANDIDATES

Candidates must report to the Secretary at the Scottish Rite Cathedral not later than 8:00 a. m., Monday, November 15, 1926. The class will be promptly organized at that time, and anyone absenting himself will delay the work just that much and confuse the proper handling of the matters essential to such organization. Candidates living in the city may present themselves on Saturday or Sunday before the Reunion for registration. This will help out materially in preventing a rush in the office on the first day of the Reunion.

Supreme Council Changes Dues Law

At the Session of the Supreme Council held at Washington in October, the Statutes of 1923 were revised and corrected, the verbal changes being quite numerous, requiring a typewritten manuscript of 24 pages for their recital.

The most important change affecting our local bodies is that to Article XVII, Section 26, and is as follows:

Article XVII, Section 26:

"Amend this Section by making suspensions for non-payment for two years automatic, and restoration likewise automatic within two years, provided that the Sovereign Grand Inspector General or Deputy may consent to remission of dues. The revised Section shall then read as follows:

"Section 26. A member of a Subordinate Body who shall be in arrears for dues for two years shall thereby become suspended, unless such dues are remitted, as herein provided, or further time not exceeding twelve months is granted by a majority vote of the members present at a stated meeting.

"A member suspended for non-payment of dues who shall within two years pay the arrearages due at the time of his suspension, together with such further dues as would have accrued against him to the date of such payment had he retained his membership, shall be thereby restored. But if the member fails to pay such dues within two years from the time of his suspension, he shall not be restored unless the Body shall so order by a majority vote of those present at a stated meeting. A body may, by a majority vote, with the consent of the Sovereign Grand Inspector General, or of the Deputy of the Supreme Council, remit all or any part of such delinquent dues."

From the above it will be seen that it is no longer optional with our bodies to permit a member who is in arrears to retain his membership. The annual report is made to the Supreme Council, with a Roster of Membership, as of December 31st, so that this year we will not be permitted to report a member who owes for the years 1924 and 1925.

Three courses are permissible:

First. Remit and cancel the dues.

Second. Grant further time, not exceeding one year.

Third. Suspend the member and strike his name from the roll.

It is evident that the *First* course should be taken only when it is impossible for the brother to pay. The *Second* action is only to temporize and is useless if the disability is permanent. The *Third* action is automatic and requires no vote of the Bodies.

Your Will

The Scottish Rite has custody of the wills of many of its members and has provisions for the proper handling of the wills of our deceased brethren. This service should not be lightly valued. It costs the members nothing, and yet too many of our members do not act as though they appreciated the all-important necessity of keeping their wills up to date. They often neglect to attend to this matter until it is too late.

The all-devouring scythe of time cuts the brittle thread of life when least expected. None of us can tell when the summons shall be handed to us, but each one should safeguard the future welfare of those left behind at least to the extent of leaving an expression of his will or wish regarding the distribution of his estate.

Has there been a change in your family relations? A birth or a death? A marriage or a divorce? If so, your will may be out of date, and should be recalled, destroyed by you and a new will executed. Do not procrastinate. Should you desire to make any change in your will, write at once to the Secretary, who will send you a blank form, from which you can make a new one.

A Word to Candidates from the Entertainment Committee

One of the principal duties of the Entertainment Committee is to look after the comfort and entertainment of those taking the degrees during our Scottish Rite Reunions. This is a pleasant duty and one of the many results is the formation of life-long friendships, which are begun during these Reunions.

The Entertainment Committee plans to meet all incoming trains beginning Sunday evening, November 14, for the purpose of escorting candidates and visitors to the Cathedral or hotel. Cars will also be at the service of members of the class during the entire week and the members of the Entertainment Committee will be on hand to render any service possible, even to running errands.

Out-of-town candidates may facilitate matters by communicating with George W. Tod, Box 982, Austin, Texas, chairman of the Entertainment Committee, and advising him of the date and hour of their arrival. He will also be glad to make hotel reservations or any other arrangements, if the candidates will make their wants known to him.

The Entertainment Committee will have charge of the serving of two meals each day during the Reunion for the convenience of the candidates. This saves time and confusion and adds much to the pleasure of our meetings. Meals will be furnished to all members of the class by the Scottish Rite Bodies during the time the degrees are being taken.

It is planned that the class will be taken to the Scottish Rite Dormitory for girls for one meal so that they may see this beautiful building which the Scottish Rite Bodies of Texas have built, learn how it is being handled and meet the charming young ladies who make that their home while attending the University. This visit to the Dormitory will probably be made on the evening of November 15.

The chairman of the Entertainment Committee and the individual members extend to you a most cordial invitation to be with us and assure you that they will do all in their power to make your visit long remembered as one of the most pleasant experiences of a lifetime.


