

ADMISSION BY CARD ONLY

Brethren will please take notice that, in accordance with the Statutes of the Supreme Council and under our By-Laws, a Brother not in possession of an identification card for the current year cannot be admitted to the meetings of the reunion or of the Bodies of the Rite. Identification cards must be presented to the registration committee. **THIS RULE IS IMPERATIVE.**

Identification cards can only be issued by the Secretary, upon payment of dues in full, including the calendar year.

VISITORS

The law requires all visitors to have properly authenticated patents or letters of credence, together with identification cards, from Bodies recognized by and in relations of amity with the Supreme Council of the Southern Masonic Jurisdiction, A. A. S. Rite of the United States of America.

SUSPENSION IN BLUE LODGE

If a member is suspended in his Blue Lodge for nonpayment of dues, or other cause, he automatically loses his membership in the Scottish Rite Bodies.

REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE SCOTTISH RITE BODIES

Regular meetings of the Scottish Rite Bodies are held on the first Friday in each month.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Kindly notify the Secretary of any change in your postoffice address, in order that communications addressed to you may be delivered promptly. The last address furnished him is the one used, and should you change your residence without notifying him your mail may fail of delivery.

SPECIAL TO CANDIDATES

Candidates must report to the Secretary at the Scottish Rite Cathedral not later than 8:00 a. m., Monday, November 11, 1929. The class will be promptly organized at that time, and anyone absenting himself will delay the work just that much and confuse the proper handling of the matters essential to such organization. Candidates living in the city may present themselves on Saturday or Sunday before the Reunion for registration. This will help out materially in preventing a rush in the office on the first day of the Reunion.

The Seventh Degree, or Provost and Judge, has for its chief lesson the great principle of justice. Those with the power of judgment should judge impartially, without any personal consideration, without prejudice or preconception and without haste. Two kinds of injustice may be done a fellow-man: one where a man does an injury to another, the other where he fails to avert an injury when it is in his power to do so. A man may repent, be forgiven both by God and man, yet the consequences remain. In judging a wrong, we should remember the motive and temptation. Some men are born with noble instincts, while others are less fortunate. Perhaps the man who leads a clean life has never had the temptation which came to his fallen brother; so we should judge with charity and pitying kindness.
