1896-1969



James Cullis Jones was born in Chelsea, Indian Territory. The Territory came into the Union in the early part of this century. Brother Jones spent his entire life in service to his community, fraternity and church.

His Masonic career was an illustrious one. He was raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason in Frontier Lodge No. 38, AF&AM, Stillwater, Oklahoma on February 7, 1923. He received his Scottish Rite Degrees in the Ancient Bodies in October, 1948, and was created a Noble of the Mystic Shrine in Ben Hur Temple on November 11, 1948. Brother Jones served the Scottish Rite on the Membership Committee for several years. He worked in several Scottish Rite Degrees and was Degree Master of the Twenty-fourth Degree. He was a very active DeMolay Advisor for years and served as "Chapter Dad" for a long time.

Jimmie received his public school education in Adair, Oklahoma, and then entered Oklahoma A&M College, from which he received a degree in architecture in 1923. He was a practicing architect until 1936, when he came to Austin as Chief Architect for the newly organized State Park Board. During the years 1943-1947 Colonel Jones was on leave of absence from the Board of Control while on active duty with Adjutant General's Department. In 1947 he was appointed to organize the Veterans Affairs Commission in Texas, which was accomplished in a matter of two years.

To the memory of our friend whose devotion to his family, friends, and the principles of the Craft, was outstanding, the Fall 1969 Scottish Rite Reunion is affectionately dedicated.

Secretary's Bulletin

An applicant for the degrees in this Valley must be an affiliated Master Mason in good standing. He must have passed a satisfactory examination in the esoteric work of the Master Mason's Degree. He must have been a resident of the State of Texas for six months. If lodge membership is held outside of Texas, a certificate of good standing or receipt for dues for the current year must accompany the petition. Forfeiture of rights as a Master Mason for any reason works a forfeiture *ispo facto* of all rights in the Scottish Rite.

It is not required that the degrees in all of the different Bodies shall be taken at one session. A candidate may stop at the close of any one Body, if it is not convenient to proceed further.

PATENTS

Handsomely executed patents (in English) will be furnished all new members who attain the Thirty-second degree. They are issued under the seal of the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States of America, and will be mailed from the Secretary's office in Austin approximately eight weeks after the close of the Reunion. A picture and list of the members of the Class will also be furnished those completing the thirty-second degree.

RING 14°

Perfect Elus (14°) of this Jurisdiction should wear the ring of the degree on the third finger of the left hand (not counting the thumb); it should be a flat gold band; engraved within the ring the motto of the degree, "*Virtus Junxit Mors Non Separabit*" (Whom Virtue Unites Death Cannot Separate), also the name of the brother, and the date on which he received the Fourteenth degree. The cost of this ring is included in the fees.

ADMISSION BY CARD ONLY

Brethren will please take notice that, in accordance with the Statutes of the Supreme Council and under our By-Laws, a Brother not in possession of an identification card for the current year cannot be admitted to the meetings of the Reunion or to the Bodies of the Rite. Identification cards must be presented to the registration committee. **THIS RULE IS IMPERATIVE.**

Identification cards can only be issued by the Secretary, upon payment of dues in full, including the calendar year.

VISITORS

The law requires all visitors to have properly authenticated patents or letters of credence, together with identification cards, from Bodies recognized by and in relations of amity with the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of the United States of America.

SUSPENSION IN BLUE LODGE

If a member is suspended in his Blue Lodge for non-payment of dues, or other cause, he automatically loses his membership in the Scottish Rite Bodies.

REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE SCOTTISH RITE BODIES

Regular meetings of the Scottish Rite Bodies are held on the first Friday in each month at 7:30 P.M.

SPECIAL TO CANDIDATES

Candidates who are beginning their Scottish Rite Degrees should report to the Business Manager at the Scottish Rite Temple, 907 West Eighteenth Street, not later than 7:30 A.M., Friday, September 19. The class will be organized promptly at that time. Candidates living in the city should present themselves on Thursday, September 18 between 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. for registration. Candidates who have previously received part of the Degrees may register at their convenience (see Program for schedule of Degrees).

MASONIC INSTITUTIONS IN TEXAS

Throughout the years Masons have taken pride in providing for the widows and orphans of their deceased Brethren and for those of their Brethren who, because of being aged, have become unable to take care of themselves. Today Texas Masons are following the pattern set by their forefathers.

The Home for Aged Masons, located in Arlington, Texas, is the home for many Masons and their wives who have reached an age which makes it impossible for them to care for themselves. This institution is operated by the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons, and is open to Texas Master Masons and their widows. The widows are cared for through an arrangement with the Grand Lodge of Texas and come under the direct supervision of the Superintendent of the Masonic Home and School.

In order to properly care for the orphans of Texas Masons, the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge maintains and operates the Masonic Home and School at Fort Worth. This Home should be of particular interest to all Masons throughout Texas. Its spacious grounds and well-kept buildings provide a real home for the children of our deceased Brethren. The school is an efficiently-operated institution which prepares the child for further education in college or a job as the case might be.

SCOTTISH RITE DORMITORY AUSTIN, TEXAS

The Scottish Rite Dormitory for Girls is an institution erected near the campus of the University of Texas in Austin to provide for the daughters of Master Masons "suitable living quarters while attending the University, at a moderate price, and to surround them during their University course with wholesome and pleasant environment, and with the associations of home life, in addition to its comforts and conveniences." This object was the result of efforts by the late Samuel Poyntz Gresham, 33°, Sovereign Grand Inspector General in Texas.

The Dormitory is a five-story fireproof building designed originally to accommodate 315 girls. The capacity has been increased until approximately 340 girls are taken care of each school year. Recent improvements to the Dormitory include the construction of a beautifully appointed swimming pool, and the complete air conditioning of the building. The Dormitory is under the direction of Mrs. F. C. McConnell who is assisted by a staff of trained matrons and counsellors. Judge James W. McClendon of Austin is Titular President of the Dormitory Board of Directors.

Each of the seven Scottish Rite Bodies in Texas has played an important part in the construction and maintenance of the Scottish Rite Dormitory. The Board of Directors is made up of representatives named by each of the Bodies. Their aim has been, as stated above, to offer suitable living quarters at a moderate price, and although the cost per student has necessarily been increased to meet the higher cost of operation, the Dormitory continues to offer its residents the best of living conditions at a price comparable with that charged by other resident halls in the area.

Applications should be presented to the Director well in advance of the date that entrance is desired as there is always a waiting list.

TEXAS SCOTTISH RITE HOSPITAL FOR CRIPPLED CHILDREN




One of the most outstanding contributions of Texas Scottish Rite Masons in Texas to the future citizens of our State is the Crippled Children's Hospital located at Dallas. The Hospital was established in 1923 and since that time countless thousands of unfortunate children have been treated.

The Crippled Children's Hospital is sponsored by all of the Scottish Rite Bodies in Texas and is under the supervision of a Board of Directors composed of representatives from each Consistory. Admission to the Hospital is limited to those crippled children who live within the State of Texas whose parents are not financially able to bear the expense of the necessary treatment. The cost of operating the Hospital is met primarily from bequests and contributions. An Endowment Fund has been started for the purpose of perpetuating this benevolent institution. If you are interested, and well you might be, in making a bequest to this Fund, please contact your Secretary. Many Brethren throughout the State have made provisions in their wills so that their contribution to the Hospital will be a permanent memorial.

Admission to the Hospital is based on the following conditions:

1. That a child's home be in Texas.
2. That its parents be unable to bear the expense of treatment in a private hospital.
3. That its affliction be judged curable.
4. That the child shall not have reached its fifteenth birthday.

To commemorate "100 YEARS OF SCOTTISH RITE MASONRY IN TEXAS", your centennial committee has constructed a Library and Museum in Waco, to serve as an education facility and as an historical monument for the benefit of both Masons and the general public.

The suggestion was enthusiastically adopted by the centennial committee and each member pledged his support to the project. The committee, also, voted unanimously to override protests of modesty from our Sovereign Grand Inspector General in Texas and to name the edifice the

WHAT ARE THE 33° AND KCCH?

The Thirty-third is a Degree conferred by the Supreme Council upon members of the Rite in recognition of outstanding service to the Rite or, in public life, to the principles taught in the Degrees. The 33° cannot be asked for and if asked for must be refused. At its regular biennial session held in Washington, D. C., in odd-numbered years, and beginning on the third Monday of October, the Supreme Council elects members of the Rite who have been Knights Commander of the Court of Honour not less than four years to receive the Degree—not more than one 33° for the first hundred and one 33° for each additional two hundred 32° Masons created in the State during the preceding two years. These 33° Masons are Inspectors General Honorary and honorary members of the Supreme Council. The active members of the Supreme Council are chosen from among them.

At its biennial session certain 32° Masons who have been 32° Masons at least forty-six months, and who have rendered signal service to the Rite, are chosen to receive the Rank and Decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour, at the ratio of one KCCH for every fifty 32° Masons created in the State during the preceding two years. The decoration is conferred in a very impressive ceremony of investiture in the local bodies. This is a Rank and Decoration and not a Degree. The members who hold it are designated "32° KCCH." A member must be a KCCH for at least four years before he can be nominated for election to receive the 33°.

In the Austin Bodies are eighteen Thirty-third Degree Masons and fifty-five members who have been honored with the Rank of Decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honor. Their names are listed below:

SCOTTISH RITE FOUNDATION OF TEXAS, INC.

Established in 1955, the Scottish Rite Foundation of Texas is making splendid progress in the role of assisting the two outstanding Texas Scottish Rite philanthropies, namely, the Scottish Rite Hospital for Crippled Children at Dallas and the Scottish Rite Dormitory for daughters of Master Masons at Austin. Another purpose of the Foundation is to aid talented young people who choose Government Service as a career, to obtain the best education and training with which to perform superior public service in community, state and national government.

The Foundation Scholarship Awards Committee is now receiving applications for Scholarship Awards. An applicant must be a Texas graduate of an accredited institution with a major in Government or Political Science, of good moral character, recommended for by at least three persons of mature judgment of proven loyalty to the American form of government, of superior ability as reflected by his undergraduate record, and possessed of a balanced personality that is pleasing to the public. Since 1956, 161 Scottish Rite Fellows have been selected from thirty of the forty Masonic Orients in the Southern Jurisdiction; thirty-two candidates are in the 1964-65 class. The Scottish Rite Fellows at George Washington have represented all parts of the United States.

University Scottish Rite Fellows are now assigned to United States embassies overseas, on foreign desks in the State Department, and in other branches of government with foreign assignments. As the program approaches its tenth year, a resume of what they have done and where they are now reveals a wide variety of public service.

53 are in Federal Service.

17 became PhD candidates—4 have received their degrees and the others are still pursuing them.

14 are teaching subjects in Government at the college level.

13 are completing their military service.

9 are in business—5 have foreign assignments.

5 are housewives—3 had federal positions before marriage.

3 are in city government.

2 are in theological seminaries.

45 are still candidates for Master's Degrees.

1. The American public school, nonpartisan, nonsectarian, efficient, democratic, for all of the children of all the people.
2. The inculcation of patriotism, respect for law and order, and undying loyalty to the Constitution of the United States of America.
3. The compulsory use of English as the language of instruction in the grammar grades of our public schools.
4. Adequate provision in the American public schools for the education of the alien populations in the principles of American institutions and ideals of citizenship.
5. The entire separation of Church and State, and opposition to every attempt to appropriate public moneys—federal, state or local—directly or indirectly, for the support of sectarian or private institutions
