To The Candidate

You are about to enter the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, having been chosen by your Brethren for that high honor. It is not an idle step. Scottish Rite Masonry is a philosophy of life, teaching the relations which you should sustain toward your fellow man, as well as your relations to God, and the ceremonies should be approached reverently, and with earnestness of purpose.
