1901-1975



Brother Wolfe was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Riverside Lodge No. 1194, Fort Worth, Texas. After establishing his permanent residence in Austin, Texas, he affiliated with Austin Lodge No. 12. In October, 1944, he received the Scottish Rite Degrees and in November of that year he was created a Noble in Ben Hur Temple. Brother Wolfe was a dedicated Scottish Rite Mason and served faithfully for many years in the Scottish Rite Sanhedrin. On November 9, 1971, the Scottish Rite honored him with the Rank and Decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour. In the year 1952 he served as Potentate of Ben Hur Shrine, Brother Wolfe was also a member of Lone Star Chapter No. 6, R.A.M., and Austin Council No. 2, R. & S.M. of the York Rite.

To the memory of our friend and brother, Oliver Lester Wolfe, this 1975 Fall Reunion Class of the Austin Scottish Rite Bodies is affectionately dedicated.

To The Candidate

You are about to enter the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, having been chosen by your Brethren for that high honor. It is not an idle step. Scottish Rite Masonry is a philosophy of life, teaching the relations which you should sustain toward your fellow man, as well as your relations to God, and the ceremonies should be approached reverently, and with earnestness of purpose. Secretary's Bulletin

An applicant for the degrees in this Valley must be an affiliated Master Mason in good standing. He must have passed a satisfactory examination in the esoteric work of the Master Mason's Degree. He must have been a resident of the State of Texas for six months. If lodge membership is held outside of Texas, a certificate of good standing or receipt for dues for the current year must accompany the petition. Forfeiture of rights as a Master Mason for any reason works a forfeiture *ispo facto* of all rights in the Scottish Rite.

It is not required that the degrees in all of the different Bodies shall be taken at one session. A candidate may stop at the close of any one Body, if it is not convenient to proceed further.

PATENTS

Handsomely executed patents (in English) will be furnished all new members who attain the Thirty-second degree. They are issued under the seal of the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States of America, and will be mailed from the Secretary's office in Austin approximately eight weeks after the close of the Reunion. A picture and list of the members of the Class will also be furnished those completing the thirty-second degree.

RING 14°

Perfect Elus (14°) of this Jurisdiction should wear the ring of the degree on the third finger of the left hand (not counting the thumb); it should be a flat gold band; engraved within the ring the motto the degree, "*Virtus Junxit Mors Non Separabit*" (Whom Virtue Unites Death Cannot Separate), also the name of the brother, and the date on which he received the Fourteenth degree. The cost of this ring is included in the fees.

ADMISSION BY CARD ONLY

Brethren will please take notice that, in accordance with the Statutes of the Supreme Council and under our By-Laws, a Brother not in possession of an identification card for the current year cannot be admitted to the meetings of the Reunion or to the Bodies of the Rite. Identification cards must be presented to the registration committee. **THIS RULE IS IMPERATIVE.**

Identification cards can only be issued by the Secretary, upon payment of dues in full, including the calendar year.

VISITORS

The law requires all visitors to have properly authenticated patents or letters of credence, together with identification cards, from Bodies recognized by and in relations of amity with the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of the United States of America.

SUSPENSION IN BLUE LODGE

If a member is suspended in his Blue Lodge for non-payment of dues, or other cause, he automatically loses his membership in the Scottish Rite Bodies.

Regular meetings of the Scottish Rite Bodies are held on the first Wednesday in each month at 7:30 P.M.

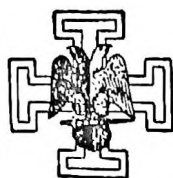

TEXAS SCOTTISH RITE INSTITUTIONS

Scottish Rite Dormitory—Austin

This institution had its inception in the mind and heart of the late Samuel Poyntz Cochran, 33°, Sovereign Grand Inspector General in Texas, and the original buildings were erected with funds donated by the various Scottish Rite Bodies of Texas.

The purpose of the Dormitory, as stated in the charter of the Holding Corporation, is to provide for the young women of Texas "suitable living quarters while attending the University, at a moderate price, and to surround them during their college days with wholesome, moral environment, and with the associations of home life, in addition to its comforts and conveniences."

The Scottish Rite Dormitory is a beautiful Georgian style building, designed to accommodate 344 girls. It is of fireproof construction, five stories high and equipped with steam heat and air conditioning, elevator, and individual room telephone service.

Admission is based on the fact that the father or some other relative is a member in good standing in a Masonic Lodge, or whose relative, if dead, was a member in such Masonic body at the time of his death.

Applications should be presented well in advance of the date that entrance is desired, as there is usually a waiting list on file.

Full information is available in the office of the Secretary of the local Bodies.

Texas Scottish Rite Hospital For Crippled Children—Dallas

The Crippled Childrens Hospital located in Dallas, Texas, stands as a living monument to the humanitarian efforts of the Scottish Rite Masons of Texas. Established in 1923, the Hospital has rendered heroic service to thousands of children who have been brought in for treatment.

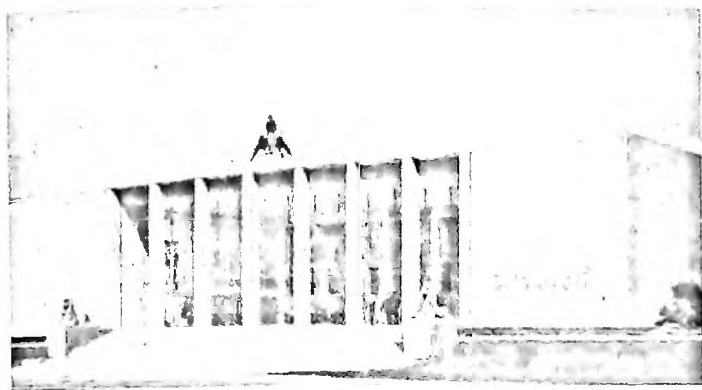
Admission is based on the following conditions:

1. That a child's home be in Texas.
2. That its parents be unable to bear the expense for treatment in a private hospital.
3. That its affliction be judged curable.
4. That it be under 15 years of age.

The Hospital was founded, and is operated solely for the purpose of treating Texas crippled children whose parents are not able to pay for treatment in non-charitable hospitals.
