SECRETARY'S BULLETIN

An applicant for the degrees in this Valley must be an affiliated Master Mason in good standing. He must have passed a satisfactory examination in the esoteric work of the Master Mason's Degree. He must have been a resident of the State of Texas for six months. If lodge membership is held outside of Texas, a certificate of good standing or receipt for dues for the current year must accompany the petition. Forfeiture of rights as a Master Mason for any reason works a forfeiture *ipso facto* of all rights in the Scottish Rite.

ADMISSION BY CARD ONLY

Brethren will please take notice that, in accordance with the Statutes of the Supreme Council and under our By-Laws, a Brother not in possession of an identification card for the current year cannot be admitted to the meetings of the Reunion or to the Bodies of the Rite. Identification cards must be presented to the registration committee. **THIS RULE IS IMPERATIVE.**

Identification cards can only be issued by the Secretary, upon payment of dues in full, including the calendar year.

VISITORS

The law requires all visitors to have properly authenticated patents or letters of credence, together with identification cards, from Bodies recognized by and in relations of amity with the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of the United States of America.

SUSPENSION IN BLUE LODGE

If a member is suspended in his Blue Lodge for non-payment of dues, or other cause, he automatically loses his membership in the Scottish Rite Bodies.

CAPS—THEIR SIGNIFICANCE

As the White Lambskin is the Badge of a Mason, so is the regulation cap the badge of a Scottish Rite Mason.

A purple cap indicates that the wearer is a 33° Sovereign Grand Inspector General and Active Member of the Supreme Council.

A white cap indicates a 33° Inspector General Honorary.

A red cap means 32° Knight Commander of the Court of Honour (KCCH).

A light blue cap means that the wearer has been a Scottish Rite Mason for fifty years or more.

A black cap indicates that the wearer has attained the 32nd Degree.

The Supreme Council has set forth a rule for the correct wearing of the cap. When wearing the cap it shall be considered to be a part of the apparel of the wearer and shall not be removed.

At the presentation of the flag, the cap shall remain in place, and the members shall stand at attention with the right hand over the heart.

During prayer the cap shall remain in place and the hands and arms shall be crossed as in the 18th Degree.

The wearing of caps is considered proper at Reunions, Scottish Rite meetings, Maundy Thursday services, etc. It is improper for the cap to be worn in cafes, bus stations, on the street, or in any other public place.

TEXAS SCOTTISH RITE INSTITUTIONS

Scottish Rite Dormitory—Austin

This institution had its inception in the mind and heart of the late Samuel Poyntz Cochran, 33°, Sovereign Grand Inspector General in Texas, and the original buildings were erected with funds donated by the various Scottish Rite Bodies of Texas.

The purpose of the Dormitory, as stated in the charter of the Holding Corporation, is to provide for the young women of Texas "suitable living quarters while attending the University, at a moderate price, and to surround them during their college days with wholesome, moral environment, and with the associations of home life, in addition to its comforts and conveniences."

The Scottish Rite Dormitory is a beautiful Georgian style building, designed to accommodate 358 girls. It is of fireproof construction, five stories high and equipped with steam heat and air conditioning, elevator, and individual room telephone service.

Admission is based on the fact that the father or some other relative is a member in good standing in a Masonic Lodge, or whose relative, if dead, was a member in such Masonic body at the time of his death.

Applications should be presented well in advance of the date that entrance is desired, as there is usually a waiting list on file.

An Endowment Fund for the permanent maintenance of the Dormitory has been recently established, only contributions from members of our Masonic Fraternity can be accepted.

Full information is available in the office of the Secretary of the local Bodies.

Texas Scottish Rite Hospital For Crippled Children—Dallas

Like a child's handwriting which grows better with time and guidance, Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Crippled Children has grown into one of the finest orthopedic hospitals in the nation. The Hospital's principal focus is on the treatment of childhood disabilities resulting from birth defects, accidents and diseases.

Texas Scottish Rite Hospital was founded in 1921 to primarily treat polio victims. Since that time, the number of patients and the scope of medical services available have increased steadily.

Admission is based on the following conditions:

1. The child's condition must offer hope of improvement through the medical services provided by the Hospital.
2. The child must be referred by a physician who must provide appropriate information on the patient. No application can be considered without a physician's referral.
3. A recommendation from a Masonic Lodge under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Texas, A.F.&A.M., or from a Texas Scottish Rite Lodge of Perfection, is requested in the patient application.
4. The child must be less than 15 years old and a legal resident of Texas. A child with scoliosis and/or rheumatoid arthritis must be less than 18 years old.
5. The parents or legally responsible persons will be asked to furnish information about their gross income and net worth. The information is kept confidential.
6. There are no qualifications as to race, color or creed.

The Hospital was founded, and is operated solely for the purpose of treating Texas crippled children whose parents are not able to pay for treatment in non-charitable hospitals.

Many bequests have been made and are always appreciated. What a fine thing to remember the Scottish Rite Hospital in your will.

SCOTTISH RITE FOUNDATION

Organized in 1955, this statewide charitable Foundation was formed to dispense charity where most needed, particularly to our Scottish Rite Hospital, our Scottish Rite Dormitory, and to provide scholarships and other fine purposes in the lines of charity, education and philanthropy.

Special emphasis is to be placed on the granting of scholarships to worthy graduate students who are preparing for careers in Public School Administration.
